matches screened and trained volunteers with people with mental health problems. Compeer's community based mental health programme aims to improve the quality of life and self-esteem of people with mental illness through one-to-one support with a volunteer.

Jami are delighted to be affiliated with the Compeer network and will be launching the Compeer @ Jami programme in the Spring.

Compeer will incorporate our existing befriending programme. The Compeer Volunteer will meet with their friend regularly to participate in social/leisure activities. However, in addition, the service

will enable Compeer friends to support people to attend appointments, college, work etc and with small tasks at home.

Through this new partnership, we hope to significantly increase the number of people we can support through our exceptional and award winning volunteer service.
